Places where we are joyful and thrive and each one has a pathway to adult success.


Let's ask the folks who experience high schools and middle schools every day to be the ones to figure out how to do this--and then share their ideas to inspire and inform others.

Focus on Human Values

Seek as many ways as possible to get to know your end users including immersion, observation, and co-design.

Focus on Human Values

Why?

In order to create change that empowers communities from the inside-out, we must place users at the center of all our work. They are the experts on the challenges that face their community.

To do this as designers, we must invest in getting to know the community and honor the stories they share with us.

In addition, we must honor human values on our own design teams and make time for emotions.

How

- Listen from a place of love. Be humble and acknowledge that you are not the expert.
- Honor the stories, experiences, and emotions people share with you.
- Stay connected to the community in all phases of the project.
- Engage in collective sense-making.

What is Involved?

Participating schools form a redesign team consisting of students, teachers, and school leaders, and are encouraged to include family and other community members.

Commit to engage in 3 design sessions with the Everyone Graduates Center team (synchronously or asynchronously) between September 2023 and January 2024.

Virtually share your experience with other schools involved in this design opportunity in February 2024.

School Redesign Goes to Washington, DC

Representatives from selected teams will travel to Washington, DC in May 2024 for an all-day session with other design teams and congressional, US Department of Education staff. Travel cost for 4 members per team will be covered. There will also be an option to do a video presentation







Each Year the School Redesign Showcase will have a Theme

This year's' theme is how do we design a middle or high school which enables all students and adults to experience Agency, Belonging and Connectedness.

When schools foster agency, belonging and connectedness, schools are joyful places, where everyone wants to be, and an can discover their pathway to adult success

We are inviting middle and high schools, to focus their redesign efforts on one or more of these to enable students and adults in the school to have increased agency, belonging, and/or connectedness

This could be through a new experience, a change to the school day, enabling more choice and voice or another way you create.

Belonging


truly are and as an equal participant in how things are created

How might our school community create spaces and opportunities that enable a culture of belonging?




Belonging entails being respected at a basic level that includes the right to both co-create and make demands upon society.
